Dear Provost Kellogg and Dean Clark:

Thank you for your interest in partnering with the University of Wisconsin Green Bay (UW-Green Bay) Nursing and Health Studies to provide an opportunity for your students to complete a baccalaureate degree in nursing through our BSN-LINC National Online RN to BSN Program. This letter amends and replaces the original Partnership Letter dated February 6, 2017 incorporating the recent changes you have made in your Associate in Applied Science Degree in Nursing (AAS) curriculum.

Students who have earned an AAS from Lake Michigan College (LMC) (as verified by an official transcript) are eligible to apply for admission to UW-Green Bay's BSN-LINC Program. All students seeking admission to the UW-Green Bay's BSN-LINC Program must first apply and be admitted to UW-Green Bay. Students will be subject to the UW-Green Bay baccalaureate degree requirements in effect at the time of matriculation into UW-Green Bay. In addition, applicants must have earned a grade point average of at least 2.5 upon the completion of their AAS. (Note: Upon the recommendation of the UW-Green Bay nursing faculty, exceptions can be made.) Finally, students will need to show proof of RN licensure before they will be eligible to take upper level nursing courses.

A listing of how an earned AAS from LMC and other LMC courses satisfy UW-Green Bay's BSN-LINC degree requirements can be found on the attached LMC to UW-Green Bay Transfer Table.

The University of Wisconsin-Green Bay requires a minimum of 120 earned degree credits for a bachelor's degree in nursing. The minimum number of credits to be taken with UW-Green Bay

is 30 credits including 15 credits in upper-level nursing. The UW-Green Bay requirements for graduation consist of 18 credits of general education, 12-15 credits of support courses for the nursing major and 30 credits of upper-level nursing courses.

Following a review of LMC's current AAS requirements, we have determined that graduates will have met the associate degree requirements plus the following BSN requirements as identified on the attached LMC to UW-Green Bay Transfer Table: Expository Writing (met with ENG 102) and Chemistry (met with CHEM 104). Additionally, AAS graduates taking MATH 123 will have met the Quantitative Reasoning and Statistics requirements of the BSN. Further, any LMC course appearing on the Transfer Table used by graduates to meet the Humanities AAS requirement will count as meeting the respective BSN requirement as found on the Transfer Table. Finally, LMC Associate Degree in Nursing graduates may transfer additional LMC courses to meet the corresponding BSN degree general education and nursing support requirements as found on the Transfer Table. This enables AAS graduates the ability to meet all but the 30 upper level nursing credits (requirements) which will need to be taken through UW-Green Bay's BSN-LINC National Online RN to BSN Program.

The awarding of baccalaureate degree credit and satisfaction of requirements is subject to all UW-Green Bay and University of Wisconsin System policies. The Dean of Health, Education and Social Welfare will inform you, in writing, if there are policy, program or curricular changes that would impact your students' ability to enroll in and complete the BSN-LINC Program as described above. Any changes in your AAS in Nursing Program or other course requirements could also have an impact on the transferability of coursework or satisfaction of degree requirements, so please inform us immediately if any changes occur.

Assuming that the contents of this letter and the accompanying table meet with your approval, kindly sign, date and return this Partnership Letter on the lines provided below accepting our partnership to the attention of Jan V. Malchow, Manager of Student Outreach, Nursing and Health Studies at the address listed on this letterhead.
