ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Andrews University and Lake Michigan College

Bachelor of Social Work

Andrews University, a non-profit university located in Berrien Springs, Michigan, and Lake Michigan College, a public community college located in Benton Harbor, Michigan, agree to this Articulation Agreement in order to create a formal academic articulation whereby students are able to transfer easily between the two institutions.

I. PURPOSE

Andrews University wishes to attract quality academic students from community and two-year colleges. Andrews University invites those Lake Michigan College students with an associate degree to consider transferring to Andrews University to complete their Bachelor of Social Work degree. This agreement will help identify those students and prepare them for transfer to Andrews University by pursuing a degree at Lake Michigan College that culminates in an associate's degree. Associate degrees earned at Lake Michigan College will contain no less than 60 semester hours of college-level work. Although it is not necessary for a student to have earned an associate degree in order to transfer to Andrews University, it is preferred.

Students who transfer can benefit by completing a Bachelor of Social Work degree with an additional two years of coursework. This greatly improves a student's job marketability and makes them eligible to complete their Master of Social Work degree at Andrews University in just one additional year.

II. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Andrews University seeks to admit students from diverse backgrounds who are interested in Social Work. Transfer students are selected according to scholastic achievement and academic potential, motivation and moral character. The main focus for selection is the college academic record. The student must have earned an overall grade point average of 2.5 or greater in all transfer credits counted for the major. If the student has attended more than one institution in the course of earning the associate degree, the cumulative grade point average of the last school attended will be the deciding factor in admittance. To be accepted as a regular transfer student under this Agreement, students must meet the regular Andrews University admissions requirements, as outlined in the Andrews University Bulletin.

All transfer students will be expected to abide by university rules and policies when on campus. For current information on Andrews University academic and student life policies, students can access the Andrews University Bulletin online at http://bulletin.andrews.edu

III. TRANSFER EQUITY AND DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

Lake Michigan College graduates possessing an associate degree will transfer to Andrews University at the rank of junior. Lake Michigan College students should use the Social Work Course Articulation Guide (Appendix A) to plan for and complete all appropriate Andrews University general education requirements. Only the equivalent of full-time work for the junior and senior years will be completed at Andrews University. The first two years of the religion requirement is waved for LMC transfer students entering the program.

Lake Michigan College graduates entering Andrews University as juniors under this agreement shall have equal access to college housing, academic programs, scholarships and Andrews University grants (for students with 2.5 or greater grade point averages), financial aid and student services when compared to presently enrolled Andrews University students at the same rank. In addition, all LMC transfer students will receive a \$2,000.00 Transfer Partnership Scholarship for each year of undergraduate attendance.

IV. ACADEMIC ADVISING

At Andrews University, Social Work students will participate in an academic orientation session explaining the requirements necessary for graduation. Students will be assigned to an advisor for selecting appropriate courses necessary for completing the major and graduation requirements as expeditiously as possible. Advising will be conducted using the Junior and Senior Year Courses to be Completed at Andrews University (Appendix B).

V. EFFECTIVE DATE

This agreement will be implemented at the beginning of the 2017 Spring semester registration at Andrews University and reviewed every two years thereafter by both institutions. This agreement may be terminated by either institution with six months prior written notice or sooner by mutual consent.

Alteration to this agreement shall not adversely affect students who are already enrolled in the degree completing program with Andrews University at the time of any such alteration. Further, in the event of termination of this agreement, students in progress will be permitted to complete the program as it existed at the time of their entry into the program. Policies regarding applicability of new program requirements apply.
