Niles Downtown Development Authority District A

The City of Niles created the Downtown District for the Downtown Development Authority of the City of Niles ("District A.")

After a Downtown Development Authority (DDA) is established, the DDA may "capture" all or a portion of ad valorem taxes assessed against property by the municipality and other taxing authorities associated with the increase in the assessed or taxable value of properties in the district realized since the district's creation.

The other taxing authorities levying taxes on property within the DDA district may vote to exempt their taxes from capture by the DDA.

ACTION:

In accordance with Lake Michigan College's established policy, it was recommended that the Lake Michigan College Board of Trustees confirm its exemption of the taxes of Lake Michigan College from capture by the City of Niles for District A.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEE OF LAKE MICHGAN COLLEGE TO EXEMPT THE COLLEGE'S TAXES FROM CAPTURE BY CITY OF NILES DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the City of Niles, County of Berrien, Michigan (the "City"), proposed the Downtown District for the Downtown Development Authority of the City of Niles ("District A of the DDA") pursuant to Act 197, Public Acts of :Michigan 1975, as amended, ("Act 197"); and

WHEREAS, such revenues may be captured from the tax base portion resulting from growth within District A of the DDA's designated area; and

WHEREAS, any taxing unit affected by said District A of the DDA has the right to exempt itself from the capture of its respective taxes pursuant to Section 3 (3) of Act 197;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Lake Michigan College confirms that it exempts and prohibits capture of its respective taxes for use by District A of the DDA, and directs that a certified copy of this resolution go to the clerk of the City of Niles in conformity with the requirements of Section 3 (3) of Act 197.

All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provision of this resolution are hereby rescinded.

Professor Emeritus Recommendation

In August 2010, the Lake Michigan College Board of Trustees established a procedure for Professor Emeritus appointments for teaching faculty. With no expectation for a nomination each year, candidates must have at least 15 years of full-time LMC teaching experience to be eligible. In addition, a consistent record of quality performance must be demonstrated by one or more of the following:

- A recognized record of outstanding teaching and education contributions;
- A substantive record of scholarly achievement commensurate with national standards within the specific discipline of the nominees; and/or
- Clear evidence of service to the College beyond normal expectations.

This year's nominee is Robert Schodorf, a retired full-time biology faculty who served at Lake Michigan College for over 40 years. Bob was an exemplary member of the College community as a faculty member, department chair, and interim dean. He was named Full-time Faculty of the Year in 1995. Schodorf created and maintained the College's Nature Center. His leadership was collaborative, inspiring and student-centered throughout his time at LMC. Bob also served actively in the community including with Sarett Nature Center and Lakeshore High School Girls' Soccer Team.
