

**BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT
PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN
LAKE MICHIGAN COLLEGE AND
DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY**

Article I Partnership

Lake Michigan College and Davenport University will maintain the integrity of their separate programs and enter into this agreement as equal partners.

Article II Agreement on Principles

1. Lake Michigan College and Davenport University agree that any student who has been accepted into the Associate in Applied Science Nursing Program at Lake Michigan College and accepted into the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Concurrent Enrollment Program may transfer credits toward a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree completion program. See Appendix A for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Concurrent Enrollment Program guided pathway and Appendix B for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing completion articulation plan and Appendix C for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Concurrent Enrollment Program operational details plan. The graduation requirements for students who follow this articulation agreement are as follows:
 - a. Earn an Associate in Applied Science Nursing at Lake Michigan College.
 - b. Pass the registered nurse license examination per the National Council of State Boards of Nursing.
 - c. Earn a minimum of 121 semester credit hours toward the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree completion program, including the credits transferred from Lake Michigan College.
 - d. Meet Davenport University residency requirements within the selected bachelor degree program.

Article III Agreement of Program Articulation

Lake Michigan College and Davenport University, agree that a person who has completed the Associate in Applied Science Nursing degree at Lake Michigan College, passed the registered

license exam may transfer credits toward a Davenport University Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree completion program and will not be required to take duplicative course work.

It is further agreed that Lake Michigan College and Davenport University will continue to cooperate in the development of additional program plans. Such plans will come under this agreement and will be added to this document upon approval of the Dean of Health Sciences at Lake Michigan College and the Registrar/Director of Transfer Articulation at Davenport University or their designees.

Article IV Agreement on Communication

Lake Michigan College and Davenport University, agree to cooperate by communicating with each other and with common and respective publics concerning the established relationship between courses and programs at Lake Michigan College and Davenport University. Communication will include the development of various kinds of publications to inform people who might benefit personally from the opportunities provided by a bachelor degree program at Davenport University based on completion of an associate degree at Lake Michigan College.

Lake Michigan College and Davenport University, further agree to communicate concerning curriculum changes that affect the agreed-upon relationship between articulated programs and to communicate concerning the development of plans that might lead to further opportunities for program articulation between the two establishments. Responsibility for communication related to this agreement will be given to the Dean of Health Sciences at Lake Michigan College at Lake Michigan College and the Registrar/Director of Transfer Articulation at Davenport University or their designees.

All joint program information, communication, and public relations activities as well as the use of logos, trademarks, crests, coats-of-arms, etc. of each institution by the other institution on promotional material will be done only with prior notice and reasonable opportunity for input and any edition. Each institution reserves the right of refusal of any such use if agreement of use is not reached.

Article V Termination of Agreement

This agreement will remain in effect until terminated. Either party may terminate this agreement, with or without cause, by providing the other party with ninety days (90) prior written notice of termination. Lake Michigan College and Davenport University agree that in the event of termination students will be allowed to complete the articulated program which they are actively pursuing at the time termination is provided.



Other Prerequisites

Prior to the application deadline, ALL nursing applicants must complete the HESI A2 (reading comprehension, grammar, vocabulary, and mathematics) with a score of 75 or higher within 2 attempts maximum in 1 year 60 days apart. Subsequent attempts are allowed after 1 year date. (Math is scored separately and must also be completed with a score of 75).

Applicants who are non-native English speakers must also complete the TOEFL iBT assessment with a score of 84 or higher overall score, and a speaking subscore of 26 or higher. The TOEFL must be taken BEFORE the HESI A2 by all non-native English speaking applicants. For more detail, please see the HESI A2/TOEFL iBT Instruction

Applicants MUST hold a minimum of a 3.0 Cumulative/Overall GPA to be considered eligible for admission. If a student has taken any one of the outlined prerequisite ranking courses listed above at LMC, the LMC GPA will be used. If no applicable coursework has been completed at LMC, the transfer college GPA will be used.

Program Overview

This document describes how Davenport University will support Lake Michigan College Associate of Applied Science Nursing degree students by providing special access to and financial support for participating in Davenport University's Bachelor of Science in Nursing Concurrent Enrollment Program. These benefits are only available to Lake Michigan College Associate of Applied Science Nursing degree students according to the terms and conditions identified in this document. Davenport University in-seat and online classes will be available to Lake Michigan College Associate of Applied Science Nursing degree students for degree completion. All other Davenport University student policies, terms, and conditions apply to students enrolled in this Program.

All students must meet Davenport University's academic, admissions and program standards.

Davenport University and Lake Michigan College agree on the following terms and program details:

Lake Michigan College Associate of Applied Science Nursing degree students will receive:

1. Tuition Rates
 - a. A reduced undergraduate level credit hour tuition rate for students enrolling in the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Concurrent Enrollment Program.
2. Application fee waived (currently \$25.00)
3. Tuition and discount rates may be adjusted annually

Davenport University provides:

1. A Davenport University representative selected to manage the Program
2. Access to Career Services departments for qualified internship and employment referrals
3. Signing to announce the Program
4. Open House for all interested students and graduates to learn about and apply to the Program.
5. Two to Four email/ mailing campaigns per year to students promoting the Program
6. Lake Michigan College website/social media promotion and/or newsletters and posters/flyers in common areas
7. Presentations at two+ student events and two+ classroom presentations per year
8. Program information included in new student orientation packages and graduation packages.
9. Representative from Davenport University to set up information table at agreed upon locations during each semester.
10. Participation/Sponsorship at Lake Michigan College's Pinning Ceremony.

A designated representative(s) from Lake Michigan College will work with Davenport University to manage the Program. Duties to include the following:

- Serve as liaison between Lake Michigan College and Davenport University to assist in monitoring and advocating for the Program
- Assist in promoting programs to Lake Michigan College Nursing Students
- Assist in resolving any issues that may arise

Academic Services

Students will have access to all Davenport University services that include:

- An academic advisor who will advise each student through the duration of their degree program
- Tutoring
- Library
- Technology Labs
- Testing Center
- Financial aid advisors, when applicable
- Career Services

Tuition, Fees and Books
